About the Local Buying Program in Queensland

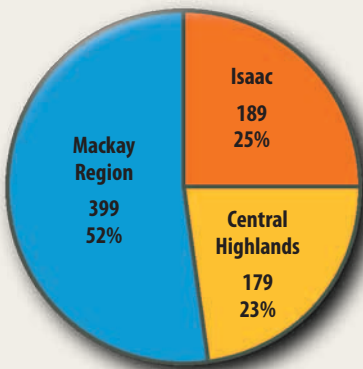

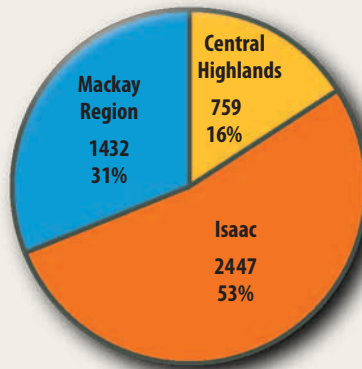

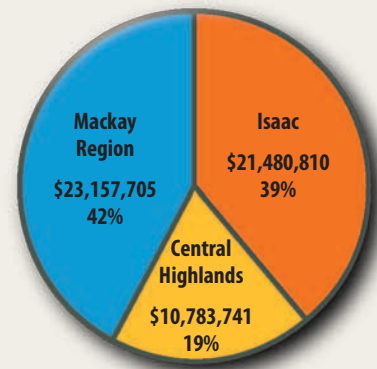

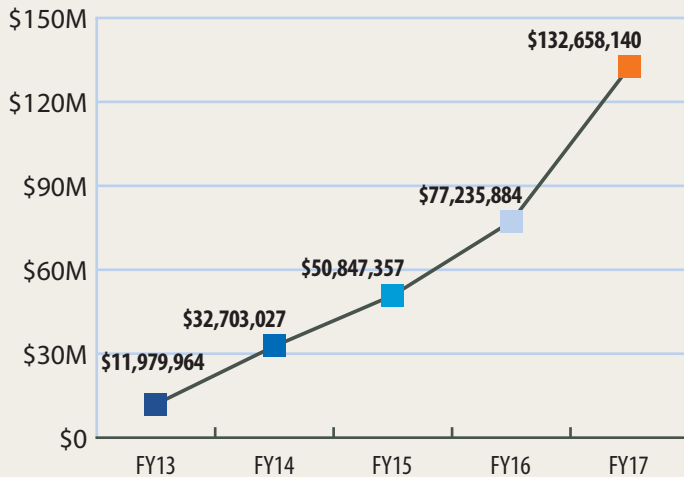
