### **Our Objectives**

The primary objective of the Local Buying Foundation in NSW is to support and deliver economic and local/regional business programs which build capacity. The Foundation's objectives and priority areas are reviewed regularly to ensure they remain relevant to the economic environment and aligned with changing business community needs. The current priority areas (or program streams) of the Foundation have been identified as:

- Building Sustainable Business Futures (BSBF) Targeting the development of the broader business community's capacity and capability. Focal areas include but are not limited to:
  - » Workforce Development Projects Projects that deliver broader traineeship, apprenticeship, and/or business professional development programs
  - » Economic Development Projects Strategic projects targeting broader economic objectives within and across regions
  - » Region Promotion and Awareness Initiatives to increase regional awareness contributing to the economic viability of regional communities, e.g. events, marketing, campaigns, advocacy
- Building Sustainable Business Communities (BSBC) Targeting the development of individual businesses capability and capacity.

#### **Our Governance**

- » For all approved transactions processed through the BHP Local Buying Program, Mt Arthur Coal makes a financial contribution to the Foundation.
- » To ensure Local Buying Foundation funding opportunities target genuine business community needs, a Local Buying Foundation Advisory Committee (LBFAC) has been established.
- The LBFAC is a representative body made up of key stakeholders from across the Muswellbrook, Singleton and Upper Hunter shires with an interest or skills and expertise in regional economic development.
