The Local Buying Foundation has matched \$35,000 with Singleton Business Chamber funding to ensure the ongoing support of the Business Development Officer role unitl 30 June 2020. The funding enables the Business Development Officer (BDO) to build on the momentum of the Chamber's Building Connected Business Communities program, which will see the BDO support local businesses across BHP's (namely, Mt Arthur Coal) operational footprint. The position will continue to facilitate the identification of gaps and opportunities for training, technology and innovation initiatives; coordination of training and development for small and medium enterprises; development of networks and alliances with local government, private enterprise and other local chambers of commerce and industry groups.




