

### LBP IDENTIFIES BUSINESS DIVERSITY

Mt Whaleback Conveyor Maintenance Team recently engaged with a local supplier to provide embroidered polo shirts and jumpers. The LBP enabled a simple engagement and procurement solution for the BHP Buyer. The small business has since been able to expand its supply chain and supply similar products to other BHP departments and local organisations.

### LBP DELIVERS ON SAFETY AND EFFICIENCY

Site Services – A/C, Fire and Security Team currently disposes of more than 500 fire extinguishers per year. Logistical issues relating to the disposal, through a Perth vendor, saw large storage of expired extinguishers on site and double handling of the load when being processed through the warehouse. Via the LBP, a specialist local supplier was identified to meet the requirements of the Site Infrastructure Department in a cost effective and timely manner while also providing an avenue to support the local business community!



### COST SAVINGS AND SAFER SOLUTIONS

An opportunity was recently identified by BHP Eastern Pilbara Engineering Team to procure suitable container blocks and chains to secure containers on site, especially during cyclone season. A competitive quoting process, via the LBP, identified a BHP verified Traditional Owner business to supply the items in bulk, creating a significant cost saving. Supply replication possibilities across various sites are also being investigated.









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Launched in July 2020, the Local Buying Foundation (LBF) is a critical element of the Local Buying Program (LBP). In Western Australia, BHP makes a financial contribution to the LBF for every approved LBP transaction. The aim of the LBF is to enhance the economic sustainability of regions within the operational footprint of BHP Minerals Australia assets and BHP Operation Services in Western Australia. We do this through the support of programs and initiatives that target local business training and development needs.
